

# **Plymouth Philharmonic Orchestra Music Scholarship**

Application Deadline: Feb. 1, 2024

The Plymouth Philharmonic Orchestra Music Scholarship is awarded to a high school junior living within Plymouth County who intends to apply in the fall of senior year to a four-year music program majoring in Music Performance (instrumental or vocal), Music Education, or Music Composition.

The scholarship is given in the junior year to enhance a student's chances of admission to the music school of his or her choice. The award of up to \$2,500 may include reimbursements for:

- Additional music lessons
- Masterclasses or workshops
- Summer music camp
- Travel costs to any of the above
- Purchase better instruments or related equipment
- Other such expenses to assist in raising the level of a student's qualifications as an applicant to a music program will be considered

## **Application Criteria**

Demonstration of Merit and Commitment: Applicants will have participated in musical endeavors for a minimum of three years, demonstrating a level of proficiency and commitment to their musical studies that predicts success at a college music program.

Demonstration of Financial Need: Each applicant will be considered based on their relative financial need.

### **Application Process**

### Step 1:

- The student completes the Music Scholarship application form.
- A parent or guardian fills out the financial disclosure form.
- The student arranges for high school transcripts to be sent to the Plymouth Philharmonic Orchestra Scholarship Committee at the address below.
- The student completes the application essay.

### Step 2:

Send the completed application, financial disclosure, essay, and any additional
music materials desired to the Plymouth Philharmonic Scholarship Committee by the
deadline of February 1, 2024: musicscholarship@plymouthphil.org (Include your last name as
part of your file name.)

## Plymouth Philharmonic Orchestra Music Scholarship Selection Process

- The Scholarship Committee reviews all completed applications.
- The Scholarship Committee, which includes the Plymouth Philharmonic Music Director, conducts interviews with up to five (5) finalist candidates and selects one (1) who receives the scholarship.
- Interview candidates will be judged on a broad set of criteria including musical achievements, future goals, focus, motivation, presentation, and financial need. A candidate may submit a portfolio of programs and/or school news articles, but these materials are optional.

### Scholarship Award

- The Plymouth Philharmonic Orchestra will make a direct payment to the scholarship winner.
- The winner must share with the Scholarship Committee receipts to show how the money was spent within one year (1) of the award and also explain in writing the benefits of having received the award.
- The Committee reserves the right not to award a scholarship when its members agree there is no suitable candidate.
