PLYMOUTH PHILHARMONIC PERFORMS COPLAND'S APPALACHIAN SPRING AND TCHAIKOVSKY'S VIOLIN CONCERTO

PLYMOUTH, MA — On Saturday, November 4, conductor **Steven Karidoyanes** leads the **Plymouth Philharmonic Orchestra** in two audience favorites. Copland's cherished ballet suite, *Appalachian Spring*, is paired with Tchaikovsky's exhilarating *Violin Concerto*. Acclaimed violinist **Julianne Lee**, formerly Principal Second Violin of the **Boston Symphony Orchestra**, takes the spotlight in this romantic masterpiece.

"I am thrilled to introduce violinist Julianne Lee to our audience," says conductor Karidoyanes. "I had the pleasure of working with her during my guest conducting debut with the Boston Pops on the Symphony Hall stage back in 2016. She was the orchestra's concertmaster that evening — and she was nothing short of incredible! I knew then and there we had to bring Julianne to Plymouth to share her charm and virtuosity with our South Shore friends."

Julianne Lee has a distinctive career as both a violinist and violist, appearing frequently as a soloist, chamber musician, and orchestral player. Performing for more than a decade with the Boston Symphony Orchestra and the Boston Pops, Ms. Lee recently joined the Grammy-nominated Dover Quartet, the Curtis Institute of Music's ensemble in residence.

The performance on November 4 opens with a joyful set of *Three Little Variations* on a traditional

Brazilian folk song penned by Grammy Award nominated, Brazilian American composer, Clarice Assad.

The concert marks the orchestra's return to Plymouth North High School's Performing Arts Center,

beginning at 7:30 PM with a pre-concert talk by Steven Karidoyanes at 6:30 PM. Individual tickets are
