# THE PLYMOUTH PHILHARMONIC PERFORMS CONCERT FOR AMERICA'S HOMETOWN THANKSGIVING CELEBRATION

PLYMOUTH, MA — The **Plymouth Philharmonic Orchestra** presents a special concert on **Friday, November 18<sup>th</sup>** in partnership with **America's Hometown Thanksgiving Celebration,** a weekend of festivities preceding the Thanksgiving holiday.

The concert will be conducted by *the Phil's* long-time music director, Steven Karidoyanes. "We are thrilled to again perform in Memorial Hall the evening before the parade!" exclaims Karidoyanes. "And, just as we delivered last year, we have another gorgeous and festive program planned this time around."

The entire second half of the concert features acclaimed violinist **Grant Houston**. He joins *the Phil* in Mozart's stellar Violin Concerto No. 5 and Vittorio Monti's fiery showcase for solo violin and orchestra, *Czardas*.

Before intermission, however, the program is decidedly all-American. It includes Aaron Copland's kick-up-your-heels *Hoe Down* from *Rodeo*, his celebration of the American West; Samuel Barber's *Adagio for Strings*, so emotional that it rarely leaves a dry eye; Florence Price's tender meditation, *Adoration*; and Nancy Galbraith's lively and infectious, *Midnight Stirring*. Rising star violinist **Grant Houston** connects with his audiences through performances known for their unbridled musical energy and unique communicative voice. He has performed in storied concert venues like Carnegie and Jordan halls to less traditional concert settings like airplane hangars, biology labs, and the Volkswagen Transparent Factory in Dresden, Germany. In addition to his solo and chamber music career, Grant Houston frequently appears with New York's Orpheus Chamber Orchestra, Boston's A Far Cry, and the Palaver Strings of Portland, Maine.

The concert will be held on **Friday**, **November 18th** at 7 PM in **Plymouth Memorial Hall**, located at 83 Court Street. Memorial Hall is fully accessible. Tickets are \$30 and can be purchased online at plymouthphil.org or by calling *the Phil* office at 508-746-8008.
