THE PHIL CASTS A SPELL WITH HOCUS POCUS: MAGICAL MUSIC, A CONCERT FOR ALL AGES

PLYMOUTH, MA — On Sunday afternoon, March 10, Steven Karidoyanes conducts the Plymouth Philharmonic Orchestra in a spellbinding concert for all ages, Hocus Pocus: Magical Music. The program features music from John Williams' epic score, Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone, Uranus, the Magician from Holst's The Planets, and the much-loved The Sorcerer's Apprentice, music considered a symphonic tour de force made famous in Disney's animated classic, Fantasia.

"Our excellent musicians and the collective power of our orchestra will be on full display in this special magic-themed program," exclaims conductor Karidoyanes. member of Hingham High School Chamber Ensemble, where he has been invited to play in the

2024 MMEA Southeastern District Junior Festival.

Hocus Pocus: Magical Music will be held at Plymouth Memorial Hall on Sunday, March 10 at

3 PM. Prior to the concert, the orchestra will hold its popular instrument demonstration

beginning at 2 PM. Concert attendees are invited to meet the musicians and learn more about the

instruments. Pro-tip: The instrument demonstration is not just for kids!
