PLYMOUTH PHIL HITS HOME RUN WITH CONCERT FOR ALL AGES

PLYMOUTH, MA — On Sunday afternoon, March 5, **Steven Karidoyanes** conducts the **Plymouth Philharmonic Orchestra** in a triumphant concert for all ages, *The Winning Score: Sports in Music*. Special guests include **NBC Boston** sports anchor, **Trenni Casey**, and **South Shore Conservatory's** Youth Concerto Competition winner, **Sudarshan Krishnan**.

“Similarities between the worlds of music and sports are undeniable!” exclaims Karidoyanes. “Both demand great skill, tremendous discipline and intense focus. Oh — and both are exciting, too. Bringing music and sports together in concert promises to be great fun — and I can’t wait!”

In this sports and music mash-up, “Coach” Karidoyanes enlists sports reporter Trenni Casey for the play-by-play as she reads the epic poem, “Casey at the Bat,” accompanied by the orchestra. He’s then off to the races with Leroy Anderson’s “Home Stretch” and tuned into tennis with “Match Point” by Gwyneth Walker. The fun continues with “The National Game,” a march by John Philip Sousa, along with Olympic gold goosebumps from John William’s famous fanfare.

Another all-star on this program is 16-year-old pianist Sudarshan Krishnan. He performs music from **Mozart’s** beautiful and enthralling *Piano Concerto No. 25 in C Major*.

This one-hour concert is perfect for youth and adults alike. It is part of the national food drive, *Orchestras Feeding America*. Audience members are encouraged to bring and contribute non-perishable food items to benefit the **Food Warehouse of Greater Plymouth**.

NBC Sports Boston's Trenni Casey is the host of Arbella Early Edition. She has worked in the sports journalism field since 2000 in Milwaukee, Pittsburgh, and Boston, and at the national level for MLB Network, ABC Sports, and Big Ten Network. Away from work, Casey enjoys travel, photography, mountain climbing, and running, having completed several marathons, including Boston.

Sudarshan Krishnan is a junior at Duxbury High School where he is an all-state trumpet player, runs Varsity cross country, and holds a black belt in Tae Kwon Do. Along with winning the 2023 South Shore Conservatory Concerto Competition, he won their Piano Competition in 2021, and the Russian music competition in 2020. Most recently Sudarshan spent a month in India to connect with his heritage, reinforcing his respect and love for his own cultural tradition.

The Winning Score: Sports in Music will be held at Plymouth Memorial Hall on Sunday, March 5 at 3 PM. Prior to the concert, the orchestra will hold its popular instrument demonstration beginning at 2 PM. Concert attendees are invited to meet the musicians, pick up an instrument, learn how to hold it, and find out what instrument family it belongs to. Pro-tip: The instrument demonstration is not just for kids!
